My only complaint was that grading was slow which caused me to be unaware of how I needed to improve the puzzles as the weeks advanced into the school year.
Exams were difficult for me regardless of study time. A more robust study guide would be helpful or at least a guide that shows more of the topic titles to study in specific.
Discuss topics in a broader way, rather than super specific info
I would rework the exams to be less about memorizing topic details and more about the understanding of broader concepts. For instance, I thought I did much better on short answer questions because I could explain my thought process and show that I know what I am talking about. Multiple choice questions can't capture that. Also, I found that they were too specific and easy to miss.
I'd like to talk more about heads of state/government and their contributions to government and society individually.

The hypothesis development assignments were helpful in some ways but I did not feel they helped with understanding the material.
